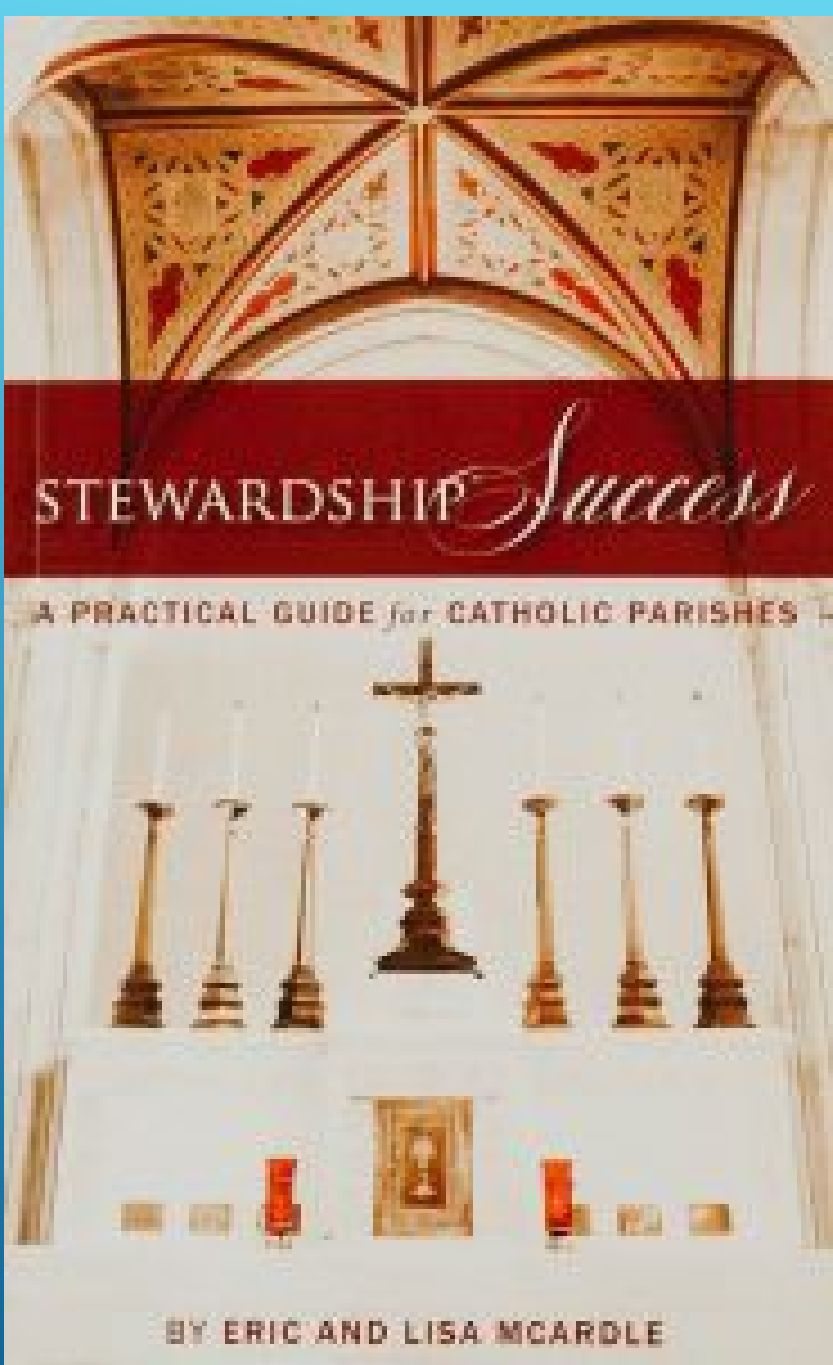

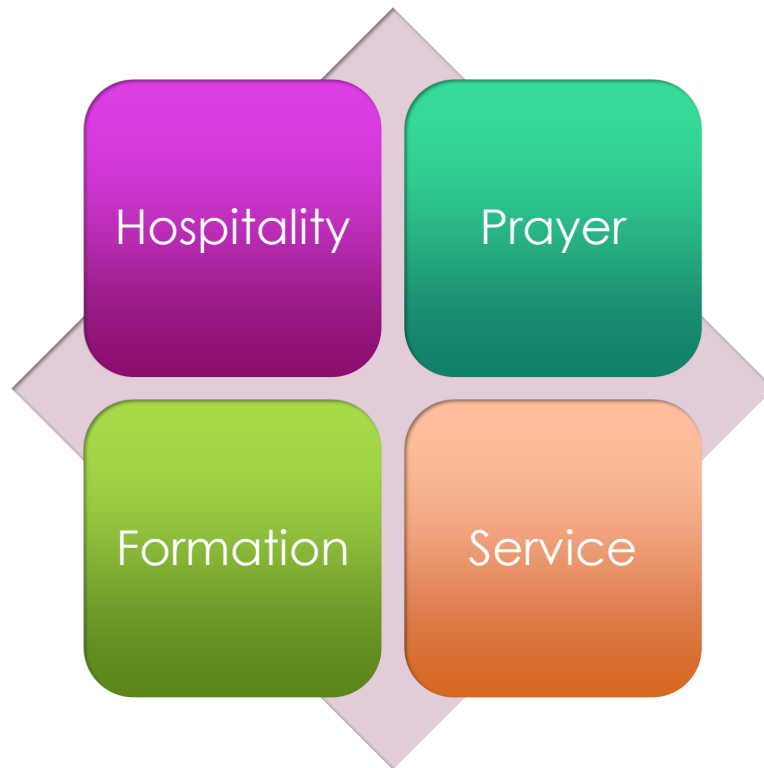

STEWARDSHIP PILLARS

PILLAR RESPONSIBILITIES

- ▶ Each pillar has a lead who guides ideas for that pillar
- ▶ Leads communicate with the ministries within that Pillar to offer support
- ▶ Subcommittees plan events, advertising, organize volunteers
- ▶ Leads develop ideas for events within their pillar
- ▶ Ideally, after an event is run successfully, it should be run by existing ministries or new ministries that are formed

Goal is to have one stewardship event every month, ideally having 3 events per pillar per year.



HOSPITALITY

- ▶ Hospitality Ministers at Mass: Welcome those who gather for worship.
- ▶ Hospitality Sunday: Fellowship and refreshment on last Sunday of the month.
- ▶ Welcome New Parishioners: Mentors provided to help guide new parishioners and help them feel at home.
- ▶ Feast of St. Ann: Annual celebration held in honor of St. Ann.
- ▶ Kupuna Connection (under development)

The Prayer Chain is a ministry of St Ann Church parishioners who constantly pray for those individuals who are in need of prayers. Prayer requests can come from anyone and the prayer intention may be for any reason for which one believes prayer will be beneficial, bearing in mind the place of our faith in answers to our prayers (*Matt 9:22, Lk 5:20, James 1:1-5*).

► Taizé is a form of Christian prayer originating from the ecumenical Christian community of Taizé in Eastern France in 1940. One is invited to rest in God through the singing of psalm verses and other simple chants, alternating with periods of silent reflection. Taizé music takes the structure of an ostinato (a simple melody that repeats over and over) and is meant to serve as musical centering prayer. The next Taizé Prayer Service at St. Ann Church will be during the season of Advent.

► We have a Rosary Prayer Service during October, the month of the Rosary, and May, the month of Mary. This year, on October 13 we will be reciting the Rosary in six different languages. - ▶ Concept: Day set aside to encourage parishioners to try a service activity. By doing so parishioners will be exposed to various tasks that are beneficial to the parish and in turn, encourage them to join and maintain a relationship with a ministry or ministries.
- ▶ Activities designed so that EVERYONE can participate (families, youth, elderly, etc.) and find something that they find fulfilling (making items to benefit outside charities, gardening, delivering food to homeless, deep cleaning church and grounds, etc.)
- ▶ First Service Day was conducted on November 13, 2021. Approximately 80 parishioners participated, and the event was well received.

Stewardship is acknowledging that all blessings and gifts we have come from God. Whether it is what we can see like our families, material possessions, careers, or those we can't see like serving, wisdom, giving, faith, healing, hospitality, teaching, and mercy.

As a show of gratitude, we have the opportunity to use what God has given us to serve Him and others. There are three ways to serve with our Time, Talent, and Treasure.

In today's busy life, **Time** has become very valuable. Yet, we are all given the same number of hours in a day, 24. How can you arrange your schedule to spend more time with God and others, whether it is in prayer or serving in a ministry at St. Ann's?

Everyone has been blessed with various **Talents**, to be shared to benefit others in need. St. Ann's offers many ministries that welcome the talents of our parishioners. Even if your talent doesn't match any of the ministries listed, your unique talent can find its place at St. Ann's.

Offering a portion of our income back to God demonstrates our devotion to Him. Receiving God's financial blessings and being that vessel to bless others is trusting the plan He has for us. Ask God how He wants you to commit your **Treasure** to be used to give thanks to Him and used for His glory.

Please review the opportunities at St. Ann's to become more engaged and take the next steps in your relationship with God and others. Consider prayerfully these questions:

1. Which pillar of Stewardship speaks to me? (Prayer, Service, Formation, or Hospitality)

Prayer Ministries

"Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)

Contemplative Prayer: A method of silent prayer that prepares us to receive the gift of contemplative prayer—prayer in which we experience God's presence within us. Eucharistic Adoration: A quiet reflective time of personal prayer. Our physical presence before the Real Presence in the tabernacle or the Blessed Sacrament exposed in the monstrance expresses an inner attitude that extends beyond the moments of prayer. Our Lady's Rosary Making Guild: The Rosary Making Guild teaches participants to make rosaries for themselves and for the missions that the guild supports. All supplies are provided. Taize Prayer: A form of contemplative worship, Taize prayer uses short chants sung over many times to express a basic reality of faith, quickly grasped by the mind, that penetrates the whole being.
